How long have you served as a chapter advisor?

I've had the sincere privilege to serve as a ΦΘΚ Chapter Advisor since 2000. I served 21 years with the Alpha Rho Mu Chapter at Lone Star College (LSC)-North Harris and in 2019 started my journey with the Alpha Rho Mu Chapter at LSC-Tomball – serving both campuses two years concurrently. Since 2011, I've also served as Texas Region District IV Coordinator, mentoring advisors of 22 chapters and making memories with life-long mentors and friends.

What is your position at the college?

My position at Lone Star College-Tomball is Coordinator and Faculty of the Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT) program and I serve as Chair of the System AAT Curriculum Team which includes eight campuses. Considering my love for students, I'm not only chapter advisor for Phi Theta Kappa, but also the Future Teachers Club.

What does student success mean to you, and where does Phi Theta Kappa fit into that story?

Student success means the ability to accomplish one's academic, personal, and professional goals through transformational experiences and with steadfast integrity while helping other people do the same. Everything about Phi Theta Kappa aligns with student success. In 1918, the visionaries of our Society could never have imagined what would be accomplished in the following years by the 4.3 million members. Here's to the next million!

Describe your most significant contribution to Phi Theta Kappa's mission.

When I was elected an International Officer, I knew ΦΘΚ community college scholarships were needed. I proposed having an annual commemorative pin made to give scholarship contributors at our annual conferences. Over the years, the Leaders of Promise (LOP) scholarship program expanded to include the Coca-Cola LOP, Coca-Cola Military LOP, and Global LOP for international students. Over 3000 students have benefitted from this initiative, and I'm extremely proud to have been a part since inception.

Why do you wish to serve as the Advisor Representative to Phi Theta Kappa's Board of Directors?

I've been a chapter and international officer, advisor, and district coordinator. I've been a scholarship winner, creator, and judge. Mentoring students, planning and implementing conferences, and presenting workshops have become a fulfilling part of my life. This has prepared me to serve as Advisor Representative to ΦΘΚ's Board of Directors. Humbly, I'd love to represent my peers by using my experiential knowledge while simultaneously learning new ways to provide additional opportunities through our life-changing Society.
