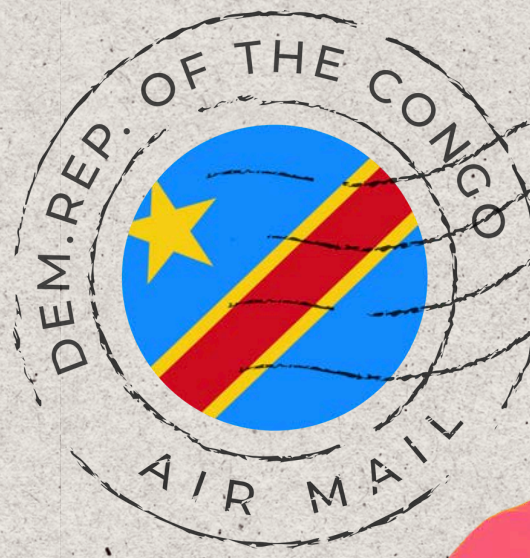


CARL BASILA

Even though I grew up in a loving family, my life was not as easy as it might seem from the outside. I lived through a civil war

that ended with a change in political regime. I also survived a gender-based assault that deeply affected my formative years. Mentally I was broken for a long time, but I never completely gave up on myself. Somehow, I kept pushing forward. **I don't even know where that determination came from, but I used it to work harder in school. Becoming the top student in my class was a way to reclaim what I felt had been taken from me.**

After high school, with my parents' support, I moved out of my home country to attend college in Algeria. My aunt joined me there a year later after being appointed as a diplomat. During that time, I also worked as a translator with the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. This meaningful experience shaped my perspective on service and responsibility.

In 2015, after my father passed away, I moved to the United States. Coming here alone without any family and still grieving, it was one of the hardest challenges of my life. I struggled deeply and cried often. **To support myself, I worked as a babysitter and later volunteered at a local hospital in Columbus, Ohio** hoping it would lead to a job. After five months of volunteering, I was finally offered a position as an operating room assistant.

After years of battling depression, I decided to enroll at Columbus State Community College and restart my academic journey. That drive to fight for my future came back stronger than ever, and this time I embraced it! I poured myself into my studies and every semester you could find my name on the Dean's List, which eventually led to an invitation to join Phi Theta Kappa. **Becoming a PTK member was a dream I did not even know I had,** especially as a foreign-born student who had no prior knowledge of the organization. Through PTK, I discovered opportunities that aligned perfectly with my academic goals particularly the undergraduate research.

Life is a trip - enjoy every step!

When I look back at my journey, it still feels unbelievable how far I've come and how much I've accomplished. For all of the opportunities PTK has given me, with a strong desire to give back and to use my talents, I am submitting to you, my candidacy for International President of Phi Theta Kappa. I hope to continue inspiring others through my story as we are concluding the exploration of the theme "Power of Stories." I am living proof that change and growth is possible. I moved from trauma, pain, fear, depression, and uncertainty to hope, peace, and purpose, all because I chose to take one step forward and never look back.



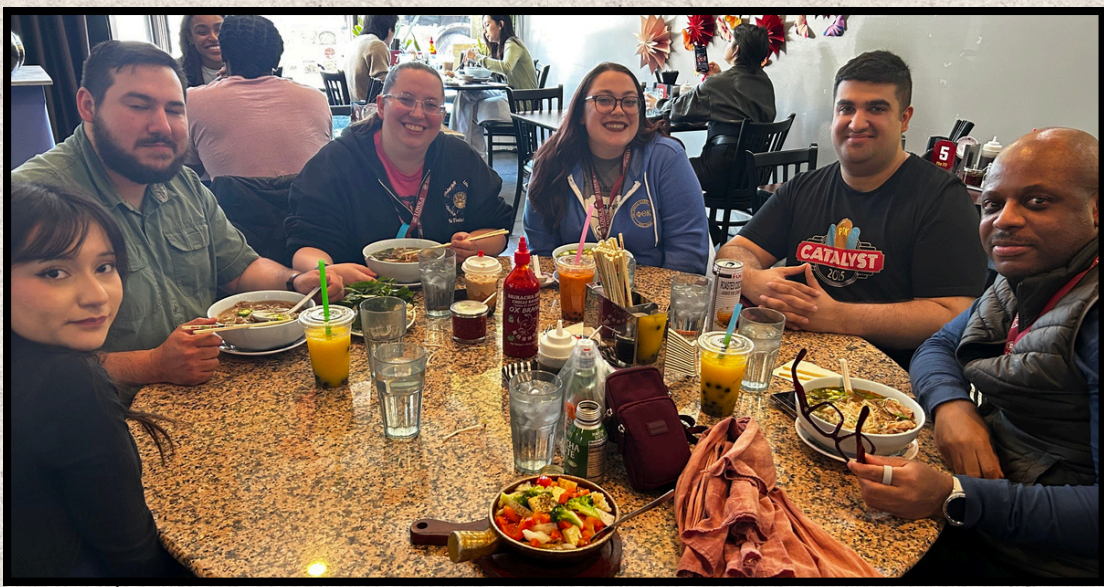
